Supplements:

We can add your supplements to your horse's grain 1 time per day. Supplements must be provided **pre-mixed** and measured in individual containers/baggies (for stalled and paddock boarded horses only) and liquids must have a pump. You are responsible for replacing your supplement when it is gone. We can add rice bran, corn oil and/or electrolytes for current market price. Please specify what supplements you will be providing:

HAY:

- We will provide quality hay for each horse. As we cannot plan for hay shortages and prices, a hay premium will be added to your monthly boarding fee if the price of hay goes up. Horses will receive 2-3 flakes of hay per day in the barns/paddocks or pasture.

Feed/hay for when your horse is gone:

- If you take your horse from the barn, you will need to fill out a feed request from (available on-line) at least **2 days in advance** for food preparation. Your horse will receive his/her grain and hay for your trips, but **do not** take hay or feed without permission. Bring back unused hay and grain.

Please let Tami know immediately if you think your horse is losing or gaining weight, so we can address it. Everyone's opinion of what a skinny or fat horse looks like is different, so it is up to you, the owner, to let Tami know and to tell her how you want to address this issue.
